Having been in a relationship with a few Hispanic women, and I don't mean to pigeonhole or say anything negative, but I know the passion that's in Hispanic women. She's not going to go without making a statement or a physical attack upon Carl. There's nothing more passionate than a Hispanic woman. Obviously she knew what she was marrying.

This is not a new story: the young, frail, vulnerable woman finds the older, father-type figure. I believe that he truly did love her.

I think he did it, but they were total alcoholics.

I keep coming back to this idea of her calling him a misogynist and pointing out that he's not living up to his politics or not living up to this idea of the modern man. Nothing's really plausible other than he murdered her.

She could just be mentally unstable.

Carl is coming across big time as a very self-indulged narcissist who has no empathy. I think Carl is full of shit, in plain English.

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There is pressure, because there is an audience, for the interaction to be cause and effect. There is a reluctance to do something internal on stage. I had a thought that maybe she knew something about him that provoked him and to this day it's never been released because it's been hidden. I was wondering if the energy of the audience would change the way they are approaching each scene and maybe another crowd might come in and it might go in a different direction.
